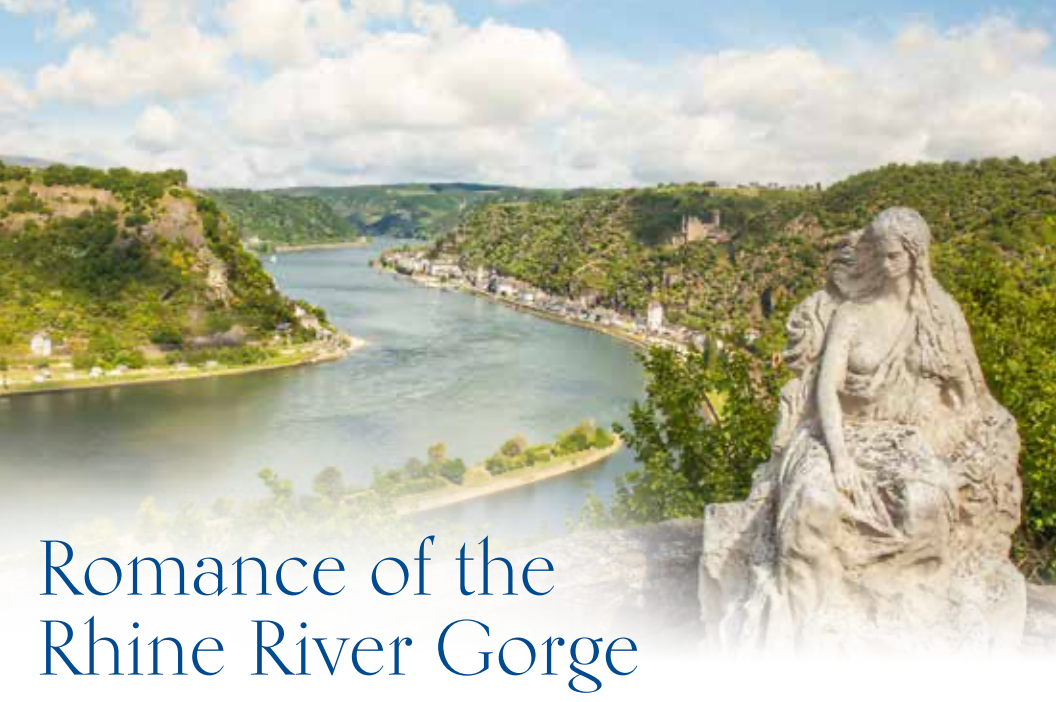


GUEST SPEAKER

Diccon Bewes

Diccon Bewes is an Englishman who grew up in Hampshire. He earned a degree in International Relations from the London School of Economics & Political Science and embarked on an 18-month world trip. He settled into a career as a travel writer and worked for ten years at Lonely Planet and Holiday Which? Magazine. He then moved to Switzerland, where he managed the Stauffacher English Bookshop in Bern.

In his newly adopted country, Bewes found himself grappling with German grammar, re-learning to cross the road and exploring parts of Switzerland he'd never heard of before. And eating lots of chocolate! He is now a full-time writer, occasional radio guest and Swiss expert (especially now that he is a Swiss citizen). He is the author of the bestselling books "Swiss Watching: Inside the Land of Milk and Honey," "Slow Train to Switzerland," "How to Be Swiss" and "Cartographica Helvetica."



Romance of the Rhine River Gorge

The Upper Middle Rhine Valley, nicknamed the Rhine River Gorge, is celebrated not only for its incredible natural beauty, but also for its connection to history and legend; it has inspired writers, artists and composers, especially during the Romantic era. Romanticism was a European intellectual movement of the late 18th and early 19th centuries — a reaction against the Industrial Revolution — focused on natural beauty, cultural history and philosophical thought. The Rhine River Gorge became a kind of touchpoint for this developing movement.

English poet Lord Byron made the Rhine area enormously popular in 1818 with his narrative poem, "Childe Harold's Pilgrimage." German poets also penned verses as tribute to the area, including Heinrich Heine's famous "Die Lorelei," set at the river's Lorelei rock. English painter JMW Turner, among others, brought these beautiful river vistas to the canvas. And musical composers were likewise inspired. Franz Liszt famously set Heine's Lorelei poem to music, and Schumann's Symphony No. 3 was nicknamed the "Rhenish" symphony. Brahms' Symphony No. 3 leads with a Rhine theme, carrying on the tradition of Lorelei, the elusive siren of the river.

Departure

Day 1 | May 31

Depart your home city.

Zurich, Switzerland/ Engelberg

Day 2 | June 1

Arrive in Zurich, Switzerland. Marvel at the beautiful scenery as you transfer to Engelberg.

Check in to the deluxe Belle Époque **Kempinski Palace**

Engelberg. Enjoy a day at leisure, and make your own plans for lunch. This evening, gather at the hotel with your fellow passengers for a Welcome Reception, then enjoy dinner on your own. (R)

Engelberg/Lucerne

Day 3 | June 2

A compact city on Lake Lucerne and the Reuss River, Lucerne boasts wonderfully painted buildings, stately churches, and two medieval, covered wooden footbridges. On a walking tour, see the imposing Water Tower and the famous

Chapel Bridge with an inner roof adorned with 17th-century paintings. Savor a traditional Swiss lunch, including fondue, at an authentic restaurant in town. Enjoy music and folklore entertainment during the meal. Wrap up with a cruise across Lake Lucerne. This evening, enjoy dinner on your own. (B,L)

Engelberg/ Lauterbrunnen/ Grindelwald

Day 4 | June 3

Visit Lauterbrunnen, a valley of incredible vistas, and Staubbach Falls, one of the highest, and most spectacular, free-falling waterfalls in Europe. Take an amazing cogwheel train ride up to Kleine Scheidegg, elevation 6,761 feet. This mountain pass is known for its stunning, unparalleled views of three mighty peaks—the Eiger, Jungfrau and Monch—which together make up a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Descend the mountain in a cable car through incredible alpine scenery to the picturesque village of Grindelwald. Spend time exploring this charming village. Return to the resort and make your own plans for dinner. (B,L)

Engelberg/Basel/Embark

Day 5 | June 4

Check out this morning and admire the scenery on the way to Basel, where you will enjoy a guided tour and lunch at a local restaurant. Embark the **Viva Enjoy** and settle in. (B,L,D)

Strasbourg, France

Day 6 | June 5

Discover the medieval grandeur of Grand-Île, the historic center of Strasbourg and a UNESCO World Heritage site, during a walking tour. See the bridges and towers of the 13th-century Ponts Couverts, and meander past the many half-timbered houses in the canal-lined Petite France district, where tanners, millers and

fishermen once lived during the Middle Ages. Visit Notre Dame Cathedral, an exquisitely ornamented Gothic beauty. Join the Captain's Welcome Reception and Dinner. (B,L,R,D)

Mannheim, Germany for Heidelberg

Day 7 | June 6

Dock in Mannheim and journey to romantic Heidelberg to visit the Renaissance-era ruins of its grand castle overlooking the picturesque Neckar Valley. Take a walking tour in the lively old town filled with Renaissance and Baroque gems, such as the old bridge, Alte Brücke. (B,L,D)

Rüdesheim/ Cruise the Rhine Gorge

Day 8 | June 7

Arrive in the heart of Riesling wine country today. Take in the vineyards near Rüdesheim on a mini-train before sampling fine wines in town. Afterward, cruise through the enchanting

Upper Middle Rhine Valley, a UNESCO World Heritage site dotted with some 40 castles, and see the fabled Lorelei Rock. (B,L,D)

Cochem

Day 9 | June 8

Sail through a splendid, narrow section of the Moselle River lined with colorful towns and tiered vineyards, then dock in charming Cochem. Delight in its half-timbered houses on a walking tour, and visit hilltop Reichsburg Castle, which offers stunning river views. (B,L,D)

Cologne

Day 10 | June 9

One of Germany's oldest cities, Cologne is renowned for its magnificent Gothic cathedral, *Kölner Dom*, built over a period of more than 630 years. Admire the old town's top sites and the cathedral's impressive exterior on a walking tour. Enjoy free time afterward and, if you'd like,

go inside the cathedral to see the Shrine of the Three Kings, a gilded reliquary. (B,L,D)

Cruising/Amsterdam, Netherlands

Day 11 | June 10

Embark on a private cruise and sail through Amsterdam's world-famous UNESCO-inscribed canals, which have been connecting the city since the early 17th century. Glide under iconic bridges and past brightly colored houses, stately stone buildings and hundreds of cyclists! This evening, attend the Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner, and raise a glass to your great European journey! (B,L,R,D)
