# Voyage of Discovery

From the Amazon River Basin, where the dense jungle teems with the greatest diversity of plant and animal life on Earth, to the emerald-green peaks of Machu Picchu, your Peruvian expedition is a journey of natural wonder and ancient mysteries. Leave the modern world behind as you begin your 11-day voyage into one of the world's most remote regions. Spend one night in Peru's capital city of Lima before embarking on a three-night river cruise through the tributaries of the Peruvian Amazon and the Pacaya-Samiria National Reserve — the largest wetlands refuge on the planet. Watch for toucans, pink and gray dolphins and tamarin monkeys on private guided excursions through the rainforest, including a nighttime jungle outing that takes you on a quest for such nocturnal animals as caiman and bats. Our expedition continues from the Amazon to the Sacred Valley of Urubamba and on to the incomparable Machu Picchu a UNESCO World Heritage site that encompasses more than 200 archaeological treasures that had been obscured from the outside world for more than four centuries.

This stunning landscape of snowcapped peaks, ancient agricultural terraces and flowering meadows is dotted with magnificent archaeological sites and picturesque Quechua villages. This wondrous valley connects Machu Picchu and the UNESCO-inscribed, ancient Inca capital of Cuzco. The highlight of our extraordinary Andean experience is a visit to Machu Picchu, unparalleled in its aura of mystery and majesty.

# Protecting Our Planet

Winding over more than 4,400 miles from the Andes Mountains to the Atlantic Ocean, the Amazon River flows through nine South American countries and vast tracts of virgin rainforest producing one-fifth of the world's freshwater supply. More than one-third of all species recorded in the world are found in the Amazon River Basin, constituting the largest plant and animal species on Earth. This majestic, jungle-fringed region is also home to many indigenous river people, or *ribereños*, who have lived in harmony with the forest for centuries. Often referred to as


the "lungs of the planet," the Amazon River Basin is home to the world's largest tropical rainforest and plays a vital role in regulating Earth's climate and producing oxygen despite the fact that survival of its wondrous species remains under threat from deforestation, mining and



agriculture. Efforts are being made to protect this natural treasure and its inhabitants—including conservation initiatives, sustainable development projects and a drive to promote eco-tourism. However, much more needs to be done to ensure that its people, plants and animals can thrive for generations to come.

# Machu Picchu & the Sacred Valley

Cradled by the soaring peaks of the Andes Mountains, the Inca citadel of Machu Picchu evokes awe and wonder like few places on Earth. Our itinerary includes an extraordinary opportunity to experience the majesty of this "lost city of the Incas" and other treasures of the lush Sacred Valley. Built in the 15<sup>th</sup> century as a summer retreat for the Inca Emperor Pachacutec. Machu Picchu was unknown to the outside world for four centuries until American explorer Hiram Bingham III stumbled upon it in 1911. A century of extensive research and study still has not revealed the secrets of its purpose, its residents or its abandonment; nevertheless, this UNESCO World Heritage site has been carefully excavated and preserved. Our exploration of the Sacred Valley's ancient engineering marvels also includes a visit to the fortress of Ollantaytambo, which stands as a lasting testimony to the powerful and far-reaching Inca Empire. Here, village craftsmen employ age-old techniques to weave intricate tapestries and sculpt colorful pottery. You will





also discover the Inca stone fortress of Sacsayhuamán in the Inca capital of Cuzco and see the UNESCO-designated city's grand Baroque- and Renaissance-style churches — a fascinating mix of pre-Columbian and colonial influences.

## 2025 | 11-DAY/10-NIGHT ITINERARY

Depart Home City/ Lima, Peru Day 1 | March 11

Arrive in Peru's cosmopolitan capital of Lima and check into the **Wyndham Costa del Sol** *Lima Airport Hotel.* 

### Lima/Iquitos/Nauta/ Embark/Amazon River Day 2 | March 12

This morning, fly to vibrant lquitos, an important rubber boom center during the late 19<sup>th</sup> century that attracted thousands of immigrants.

From there, you will embark the deluxe **Zafiro** to cruise deep into this vital and remote biosphere. Naturalists will share insight into the Amazon Basin's complex ecosystem. Attend a Welcome Reception and watch civilization fade away. (B,L,R,D)

### Marañón River/Yanayacu-Pucate River/Ucayali Day 3 | March 13

Wake up in the heart of the Amazon Basin, where the jungle teems with the greatest diversity of plant and animal life on Earth.

Enjoy a picnic breakfast served under the shade of a magnificent rainforest canopy. Watch for white-necked heron and wattled jacana dipping into nearby shallow waters.

From there, you will meet an authentic local shaman, who will perform a traditional ritual and explain how the *ribereños* have used indigenous medicinal plants and herbs to cure ailments for centuries.

Return to the boat for dinner, followed by an expedition into the darkness of the jungle. Search for nocturnal creatures — including caimans and bats on a nighttime safari by skiff into the Pacaya-Samiria National Reserve as a vast blanket of stars glow above you. (B,L,D)

### Marañón River/Nauta Day 4 | March 14

Embark on a morning fishing excursion in San José de Zarapanga — a virtually uninhabited portion of the Amazon. Skiffs will take you through the labyrinthine, Shiriyacu black water tributaries while the vessel's naturalists point out animal and plant life rarely detected by the untrained eye. Then, try your hand at catching the famous red-bellied piranha.

This afternoon, we stop in a local village for a demonstration on how to prepare an Amazonian dish known as *juanes*, a regional favorite made of chicken and rice, wrapped in banana leaves.


Gather on the vessel's upper deck to enjoy a final evening cruising the Amazon and a festive Farewell Reception as the sun sets over the rainforest. (B,L,R,D)

### Disembark/Iquitos/Lima/ Cuzco/Urubamba Valley Day 5 | March 15

Disembark the river boat and fly from lquitos via Lima to Cuzco. On arrival, transfer to the Sacred Valley of Urubamba, a scenic stretch of ancient ruins and small towns nestled in the







Peruvian Andes. Check into the **Inkaterra** 

Hacienda Urubamba Hotel. (B,D)

### Sacred Valley Day 6 | March 16

After a morning at leisure, travel to the UNESCO World Heritage site of Ollantaytambo, which contains ruins of a temple and fortress where Inca nobility fled when the Spaniards invaded Cuzco. Located on the side of a mountain along the Urubamba River, this well-preserved archeological site includes remnants of lavish 15th century palaces built for the rulers of the day. From there, you will visit the workshop of renowned ceramics artist Pablo Seminario, a gallery and art center devoted to preserving the production techniques and designs of ancient Peruvian cultures. (B)

### Urubamba Valley/ Machu Picchu Day 7 | March 17

Check out of the hotel after breakfast as we make our

journey to Machu Picchu — the lost city of the Incas. Some believe this UNESCO-inscribed, 15th century citadel was the Inca civilization's most stunning urban achievement, with stone walls, terraces and ramps that appear to have been naturally carved in the rock escarpments. Spend the afternoon exploring the wonders of Machu Picchu.

Later this evening, check in to the deluxe *Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel*, a luxurious respite from a day of touring. (B,L,D)

### Machu Picchu/Cuzco Day 8 | March 18

Explore more of the ruins of Machu Picchu or enjoy some of the natural history activities. After lunch, board a scenic train back to Ollantaytambo and transfer to a deluxe hotel in historic Cuzco. (B,L,D)

### Cuzco Day 9 | March 19

Your day begins with a tour of the Sacsayhuamán

Archaeological Park, a fortified Inca citadel and ceremonial site that dates to the 15th century. According to historical writings, construction of the complex of stone structures required the labor of an estimated 20,000 people working over a period of about 70 years.

Continue to the heart of Cuzco for visits to the historic cathedral and ruins of Coricancha, known as the Temple of the Sun. This ornate religious complex was once considered the center of the Inca world. Attend a Farewell Reception this evening. (B,L,R)

### Cuzco/Lima Day 10 | March 20

Transfer to the airport for your flight to Lima and enjoy the use of a day room at the **Wyndham Costa Del Sol Lima Airport Hotel** before your overnight

flight back to your home city. (B)

Arrive in Home City Day 11 | March 21 Arrive in your home city.

Throughout the cruise, English speaking, highly trained naturalists provide expert insight into the Amazon's amazing array of biodiversity during excursions and nature walks.

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### Lima March 10 to 12, 2025 (Program Begins: March 10)

The Peruvian capital of Lima provides the ideal two-night prelude to your expedition. The city's UNESCO-inscribed historical center showcases colonial mansions amid modern architecture. Visit the 16th-century Cathedral of Lima, where the remains of Francisco Pizarro are entombed. Tour the 17th-century Church and Convent of San Francisco and discover the opulent Casa de Aliaga, built in 1535 as the residence of Don Jerónimo de Aliaga, co-founder of Lima. This 16th-century gem is the oldest private house in continuous use in South America, spanning 17 generations. Enjoy two nights in the deluxe *Miraflores Park Belmond Hotel*.

### Cuzco March 20 to 23, 2025 (Program Ends: March 23)

Conclude your Peruvian expedition with two-nights in the UNESCO-inscribed city of Cuzco. As one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the western hemisphere, it retains examples of early Incan architecture as well as Spanish colonial structures. Visit the Inca ruins of Moray and the Maras salt terraces, known as the "salt of the Andes." You will also enjoy an excursion to a local market with a cooking demonstration and lunch.
